

Inverse Square Law Calculations and DeciBel Level Calculations

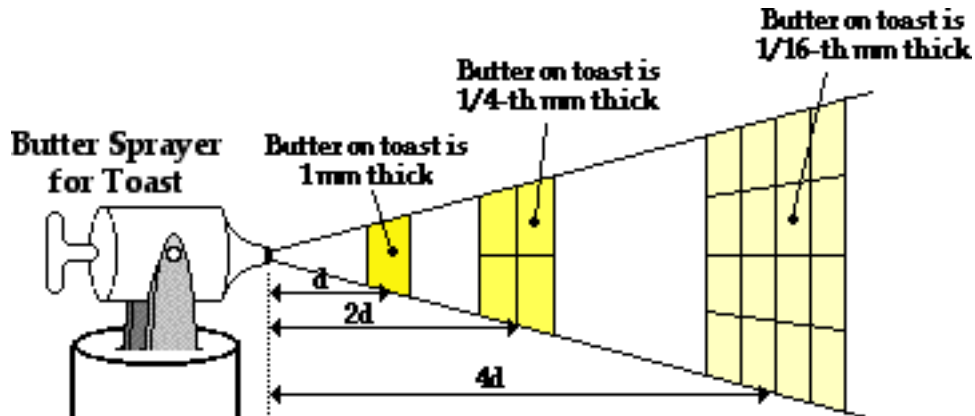

4. If a source is twice as powerful (i.e., emits twice the energy in the same amount of time), then the intensity at every location about the source will be twice as intense. The intensity at a given location is directly related to the intensity of the source. Fill in the following table.

The intensity of a sound at a given location varies inversely with the square of the distance of that location from the source. A clever analogy illustrates the reason for this inverse square relationship. Consider a butter sprayer used in a restaurant to spray butter on a toast. Toast is placed a certain distance from the nozzle (the source of butter), the button is pushed and a mist of butter is emitted from the nozzle, spreading out through space in a conical shape. If the butter is placed close to the nozzle, then the intensity of the butter landing on the toast will be greater. If the distance from the nozzle is doubled, then the butter mist will land on an area four times as large; however, that means that the intensity of butter on each individual piece is one-fourth as much. By the same reasoning, increasing the distance by four times as much makes the intensity of butter on each individual piece 1/16-th as much. Whatever alteration is made in the distance from the source, the inverse square effect will be made upon the intensity.
